Requirements:

**Individual papers:**

- All papers should be no more than 15 minutes (7-8 pages)
- Proposals should include a 250-word abstract and a cover sheet including name, email address, and institutional affiliation
- Papers will be assigned to a suitable panel

**Panels**

- Proposed panels will include 3 or 4 paper presentations
- Submitted together by panel organizers
- Panel proposals should include a session title, name of the contact person, and individual abstracts for each participant.

**Undergraduate Research Poster Competition:**

- Proposals should include a 250-word abstract and a cover sheet including name, email address, and institutional affiliation.
