Just in time for Halloween, two ATM graduate assistants will explore two collections of sound recordings held at the Archives of Traditional Music.

Isaiah Greene, a graduate student in Folklore and Ethnomusicology, will guide us through a collection of wax cylinder recordings from the Crocker Land expedition of 1913-1917. Isaiah will explore the tragic story of how these recordings were made and the horrible events that took place on the Crocker Land expedition, "one of the darkest and most deplorable tragedies in the annals of Arctic exploration."

Suyash Kumar Neupane, a graduate student in Folklore and Ethnomusicology, will examine a collection of over 260 recordings made in Nepal by Terence Bech who ventured into Nepal in shortly after the country's borders were opened to the outside world in the 1950s. His collection is a valuable documentation of cultural life in Nepal. Unknown to most, however, are his harrowing adventures in Nepal as a mountaineer.
