



## Screening of Brazilian Documentary *The Trial* with Director Maria Augusta Ramos

In 2016, Brazil's first woman president, Dilma Rousseff, was impeached and removed from office. Jailed and tortured from 1970 to 1972 under the military dictatorship, she has become a symbol for the quest of democracy of the Brazilian people. The new documentary *The Trial (O Processo)* brings to life the raucous public demonstrations for and against impeachment, the theatrical and comical vote in the lower house of Congress, and the backroom deals between politicians. It raises uncomfortable questions about the boundary between legality and illegality and whether an impeachment that follows the proper legal forms might still constitute a coup. Join GLACS and the film's director, Maria Augusta Ramos, for one of the film's first U.S. screenings. Following the screening, a Q & A session will be held with the director. The documentary is in Portuguese with English subtitles.
