## APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

We are pleased to announce a competitive scholarship/grant opportunity **for undergraduate students** pursuing majors in Anthropology. **All sub-fields** will be considered. Awards of up to \$1000 will be available for undergraduate students to fund off-campus research or study. Funds can be used toward fees and expenses associated with attending a field or overseas study program, an internship, or a faculty-directed independent research project. Completed applications, which should be collated into a single PDF in the order below, must be submitted to the current [Director of Undergraduate Studies](#) by April 1.

### A COMPLETE APPLICATION WILL INCLUDE:

1. A completed application cover page
2. A CV/resume
3. An unofficial IU transcript
4. A project proposal. Proposals should describe the proposed research question(s), methods, contributions, a research/travel timeline (500 word maximum).
5. A short statement of previous experience and how this work fits into the student's academic training (300 word maximum).
6. A budget, demonstrating how you plan to spend the funds. Please also include a brief statement of financial need.
7. A letter of support from a faculty member that comments on the student's academic work, promise, proposed research, and financial need. Faculty letters should be sent directly to the current [Director of Undergraduate Studies](#).

### AWARD RULES

- Student award winners will be required to attend the Anthropology Department spring reception in order to receive the award.
- Priority is given to students with demonstrated financial need, who have not yet received research funding from the department. If used for an overseas study program or field school, the award should be used to cover travel expenses and fees, not tuition.
- Students may accept only one departmental award per project.
