

Glenn Black Laboratory Summer Research Fellowships
Deadline April 7, 2014

The Glenn Black Laboratory of Archaeology (GBLA) will offer Summer Research Fellowships for graduate students of Indiana University Bloomington. These fellowships will aid research for dissertation, thesis, or related projects that make use of the Glenn Black Laboratory collections and resources, and contribute to archaeology or ethnohistory of the Midwest.

GBL fellowships will be awarded on a competitive basis for up to \$2,500. Application packages will include the following in a single spaced proposal:

1. Cover sheet (see below)
2. Abstract of project (250 word)
3. Project description (1 single-spaced page)
4. Relevance to the archaeology and ethnohistory of the Midwest and Indiana. (1 single-spaced page)
5. Timeline and budget for the research
6. Letter of support from the student's advisor

Awards may be used for radiocarbon dating, materials analysis, travel to collect or research artifacts or other resources for comparative purposes, time or consultation with IU centers (such as the IU Light Microscopy Center), or other facilities that provide services not offered at IUB, imaging and digitization, or payment to consultants.

Awards for work using GBLA collections, or comparative work involving GBL collections will receive high priority. The GBLA has millions of artifacts and samples that derive from a range of sites and time periods. GBLA also has the Great Lakes and Ohio Valley Ethnohistory Archives, which provide unmatched resources for students from a wide variety of disciplines who study Native American history. Students must be working with an IU faculty member who can provide mentoring and oversight for their research.

Review and selection will be made by the internal advisory committee for the Glenn A. Black Laboratory of Archaeology at IUB.

Glenn Black Laboratory Research Fellowships Deadline April 7, 2014

The Glenn Black Laboratory of Archaeology (GBLA) announces competitive Research Fellowships for doctoral students of Indiana University. The fellowship provides a stipend of \$17,000 and health benefits for the 2013 and 2014 academic year. The purpose of the fellowship is to support graduate students working toward finishing data collection, analysis, or write-up for doctoral dissertations. Proposals based on work that addresses questions of archaeology and/or ethnohistory of the greater Midwest will be considered. Students working on issues related to Indiana archaeology, making use of GBL collections, or working on sites from which the GBL has collections are encouraged to apply.

GBLA Research Fellowships do not provide a fee remission. Graduate students who can register for G901, or have finished regular coursework and passed the qualifying exam are eligible. Students will submit an application package that outlines their dissertation research and explains how their research stands to contribute to archaeological knowledge, methodology, and theory in the greater Midwest. The proposal should include the following:

1. Cover sheet (see below)
2. Abstract of project (250 word).
3. Project description—2 single-spaced pages.
4. Relevance to the archaeology and ethnohistory of the greater Midwest—2 single-spaced pages.
5. Timeline toward reaching degree.
6. Letter of endorsement from student's Advisor/Research Committee Chair.

The GBLA has millions of artifacts and samples that derive from a range of sites and time periods in the greater Midwest, as well as the Great Lakes and Ohio Valley Ethnohistory Archives, an unmatched compilation of resources for students who are researching First Nations history, culture or law. Students must be working with an IUB faculty member who can provide mentoring and oversight for their research.
